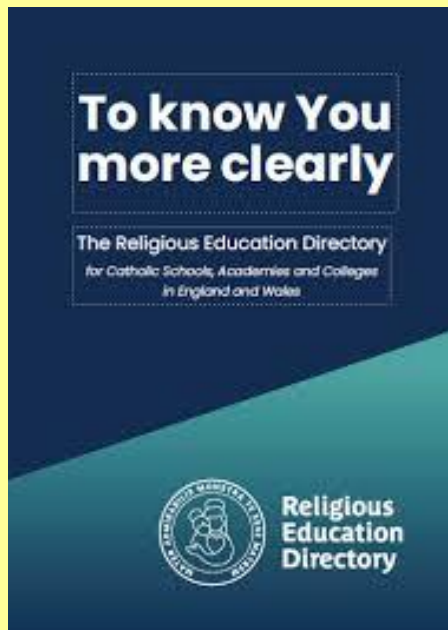


To know You more clearly

Prophecy and Promise celebration
