Paramedic

If you want to be a Paramedic you need to be confident answering a phone since loads of calls come in a day. When you arrive at someone's house before they may be a bit angry so if you get upset easily a Paramedic might not be the right job for you. You'll need three A levels, a full driving license and to pass five GCSEs at grade four or above. Paramedics get 19.2 thousand calls a day and when you are ready for lunch a call might come in half-way through your lunch-break. 134.4 calls a week and 1.965 a year. They can work over-night. They give up their family, children and family days out to help ill, poorly people who might pass-away.

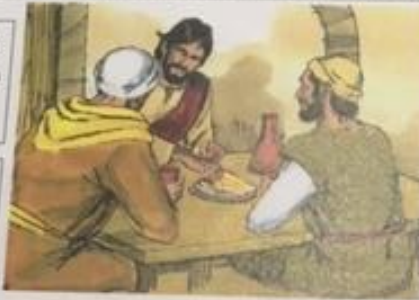

Dear Diary,

What a special day this has been! I have been lucky enough to be baptising Jesus Christ, the most-honoured person!

As I was baptising him, when Jesus rose out of the water, a dove flew near him. Suddenly, I then heard voices from up above as if it was talking to me. It said, "you are my own dear son, whom I love. I am pleased with you."

I was worried that I was not worthy of him but I think I am. I will remember this day forever.

We imagined that we were John the Baptist recalling the baptism of Jesus. We described our experience: how we felt, what it meant to our belief in God's promise and made a link to Scripture.

We studied the process involved in becoming a priest and wrote letters of advice to men who believe they are being called into the priesthood.

We watched an ordination ceremony and found suitable hymns that could be sung, exploring the symbolism within the words.

We researched different catholic religious orders: Franciscans; Dominicans; Benedictines. We learned about who founded the order and why, what living the daily life of a member of a particular order entails, how and when they pray, what they wear and what particular work they undertake to answer God's call and fulfil their vocation.

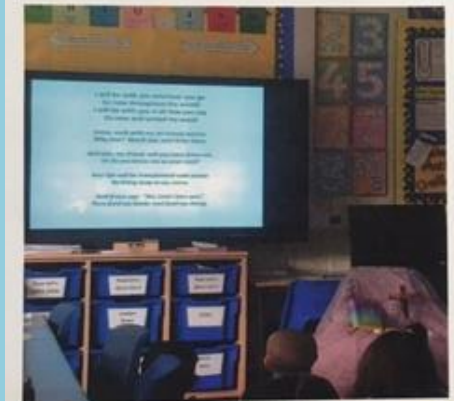
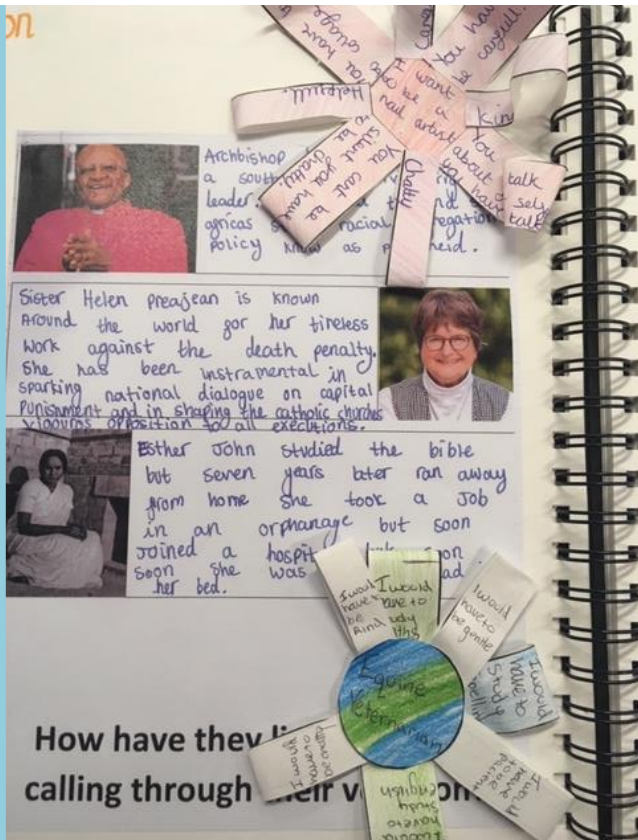
Dear Mr Jones,
