- * To help pupils acquire the skills necessary to develop and sustain relationships.
- * To offer sex education in the wider context of relationships.
- * To ensure that pupils protect themselves and ask for help and support when needed.
- * To ensure that pupils are prepared for puberty.
- * To help pupils develop a healthier, safer lifestyle.

The 2017 Policy for RSE went to consultation with Staff, Governors and Parents during the Spring Term 2017.

The new school policy was approved by the Governing Body in March 2017.

The school policy is faithful to the requirements laid down in the Bishops' Conference Guidance.

It is consistent with the Catholic mission and ethos of the school and in accordance with Catholic teaching.



Year Two

Children are taught that they are growing and developing in a community.

Key Words: God, Community, Belonging, Father, Mother, Carer, Feelings, Emotions.

Year Three

Children are taught the virtues essential to friendship, e.g. loyalty, responsibility......and experience the importance both of forgiving and being forgiven.

Key Words: care, friendship, forgiveness, health, responsibility, change.

Year Four

Children will be taught that they are all different. They will celebrate these differences as they appreciate that God's love accepts us as we are and as we change.

Key Words: Gifts, Talents, Difference, Development, Change, Penis, Vagina, Womb, Appreciate, Celebrate, Achievement.

In Year Four children see an illustrated diagram of how a baby grows in the womb.

Year Five

Children will be taught about the physical and emotional changes that accompany puberty—sensitivity, mood swings, anger, etc. and grow further in their understanding of God's presence in their lives

Year Six

Children develop in an appropriate way for their age, an understanding of sexuality and grow further in their appreciation of their dignity and worth as children of God.
